

DL2AAA Ingo Nortz Tour d'Arles... a CARGO E- BIKE TOUR


The Tour

The tour leads 1600 km along the Roman routes from Neumarkt Oberpfalz via the Bavarian Limes (Rhaetian Limes) to Arles (Latin: Arelas) and the Mediterranean.

I drive along the rivers Altmühl, Danube, Rhine, Doubs, Saône and Rhone, which is how the Romans transported their goods.

The tour is a return tour, i.e. 3200 km. Due to its size, the cargo bike cannot be taken on the train. The current planning includes around 100 km parts of the day. So with 5 days a week it will take me 3 1/2 weeks there and 3 1/2 weeks back. The means of transport is a CUBE Cargo-E-Bike with 1000 Wh battery available. Sleep is always carried out at campsites and radio transmissions are also carried out from there.





The means of transport

A CUBE Cargo-E-Bike with 1000Wh is for the transport available. It can carry a load of 50 kg and weight up to 220 kg.

The box at the front has a cover. There is space for a 50W solar cell on the cover and underneath a solar manager with a 10Ah LiPo battery for all "on-board" powered 5V devices.

The Cargo-E-Bike has a GPS tracker, on the one hand to make the bike traceable if it is stolen and on the other hand to be able to localize the location at any time.

The web address for the GPS tracker will be published. This means that anyone is interested in has the opportunity to take part in the tour virtually.

I don't need a racing car. This bike has 6 truck batteries and is much faster as a racing car



Humans have to sleep and eat

I consciously decided to go camping.

It keeps the costs within reasonable limits and allows me to be QRV two days a week. I estimate around € 60 per day for camping and meals. Unfortunately, cheap campsites are out of the question. I need a "shore connection". The usual 1.3 kW in France is just enough to charge 2 batteries at the same time with 6 A each. I have 4 batteries. Therefore, 2 Leicke 6A, 42V chargers are used.

Tent: Saleva Alpin Hut III Bed: Helinox Cot Max bed

Stove: Primus Primetech Stove 1.3l stove

Table: The lid of the bike is attached to the side of the bike and is then a nice table for eating and as a shack.

Chair: Alpinez Camping Chair

My activities are intended to promote the training and operational knowledge of newcomers in telegraphy.



TS 480SAT, 100W TX, with 2 CW filters, 250 and 500Hz in a portable case with 10" Panadapter and PC; Begali Traveler Light telegraphy key

Power supply 220V HP HSTP 29 converted with 12.5 V and 38A Antenna: Vertical for 20,30,40 and inv V 40m and shorted 80 m dipole Vertical mast: Spiderbeam push pole 10 m high


